Dear Parishioners

This weekend, we begin Passiontide as we turn more to the preparation for Holy Week, especially the Sacred Triduum. Our readings turn more to the growing angst toward the Lord in the days leading up to His arrest and Crucifixion.

Next week, we enter the holiest week of the year, with some of the most ancient parts of the liturgy in the Church's history. We see the priests washing the feet of people in imitation of our Lord, and celebrate the most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, drawing us into the mystery of the Last Supper and the gifts Jesus left the Church in the priesthood, the Eucharist, and the model of service.

On Friday, we listen to the Passion of our Lord, venerate the cross as we acknowledge our need for the Savior, and enter in the holy silence. Saturday, after sundown, we gather and celebrate Christ our Light, who has risen from the grave. We light a sacred fire, receiving its flames, listen to the Exultet, hear the readings that thumbnail our salvation history, and bless holy water, a reminder of baptism where we are brought into the life, death, and resurrection of the Lord.

While each of these liturgies is beautiful in itself, together they share a profound message, and because of that, I invite you to make every effort to be there (and if not at all three, at least at the ones you can attend.

At the time of writing, there are still three guaranteed seats on the pilgrimage to the Holy Land. After that, there may be other seats available, or late registrations may have to fly on another airline or flight. Ground accommodations are a little more flexible.

I know that I may be repetitive with so much of this, but I desire to share with as many as able this chance to walk in the footsteps of Christ, to have the Gospels especially come alive by seeing the locations, experiencing the land and the people, and pray in the most sacred sites of the Church – where the Word became flesh at the Annunciation of Mary, the Mount of Beatitudes, the Sea of Galilee and Capernaum, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Upper Room, the Church of the Nativity, and the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, built over Calvary and the Tomb of our Lord and the location His resurrection and first resurrection appearance to Mary Magdalene.

As I am preparing myself, I am entering more deeply into the idea of being a pilgrim. We are told that pilgrimages are not just sightseeing or tourist opportunities, but a way to encounter the Lord.

When on pilgrimage, an openness to what the Lord has prepared is necessary, to see all that happens as a means of the Lord showing us something important. It is a life of spiritual abandonment – to rely more fully on the Lord. I am aware that this pilgrim spirit is one that is to be ours always, whether on a literal pilgrimage or not, as we recall that we are but pilgrims here on earth.

LENTEN MESSAGE FROM POPE FRANCIS

Pope Francis said a good Lenten exercise and examination of conscience would be to compare one's life to a migrant or foreigner, "to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better advance on our journey to the house of the Father."

He also encouraged Catholics to be more synodal by journeying with others while avoiding self-absorption, exclusion, oppressing and excluding others, or being envious and hypocritical.

"Let us all walk in the same direction, tending toward the same goal, attentive to one another in love and patience," he urged.

Team, Shirley Nowak and Chris Heiderscheidt on CCW resources.




