




SUNY Adirondack has established a College Academy in accordance with State Education Department guidelines in order to provide academically capable high school juniors and seniors opportunities to take college-level courses. SUNY Adirondack guidelines require an average of 80% or higher and a recommendation from the high school guidance counselor or principal. The College Academy Application form is available for download or can be obtained from a high school guidance counselor. College Academy students are ineligible for both federal and state aid.


The [Early College Career Academy](#): An Early College High School Program, is a partnership between SUNY Adirondack and the Washington-Saratoga-Warren-Hamilton-Essex BO-CES. Students are eligible to earn up to 32 college credits, tuition-free, while earning marketable industry credentials and participating in work-based learning experiences.


College in the High School Program




High school juniors and seniors in the Capital Region and throughout New York state can register to take college-level courses through the College in the High School program.

- These courses give students an opportunity to experience a college-level course while still in high school and receive college credit.
- Credits can be applied to Hudson Valley Community College programs or transferred to most four-year colleges and universities. Depending on the school, students may be able to transfer up to 15 credits or more.




