Good Communication leads to being #Exceptional

Communication between parents and teachers is such an important part of the success of our students. One primary way that we communicate with parents is our Communication Calendar. This calendar gives the teacher a way to tell you what kind of day your child has had using a number/letter scale. This is not sent home just to be used as a punishment or reward chart. Talk to your child about what happened during the day that resulted in the score received. If the score was high, ask for examples of how your child earned that score. If the score was low, ask what events took place and ways to handle things differently next time.

Sign or initial the calendar daily to let the teacher know that you are seeing it and to let your child know that it is important to you.
