Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Onaway High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as has not been given one of these labels.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Parents should pick up an enrollment packet in the secondary office. The office is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Friday, from August to June.

Onaway High School has completed all annual required evaluations of school performance and submitted the school improvement plan in a timely manner. Our three goal areas are reading, math, and behavioral support, and will continue into the 2023-2024 school year in the maintenance phase.

Onaway High School is comprised of grades 9-12. Current enrollment is 162 students.
