Scope of Work/Narrative

- 1. The Liberty County School District (LCSD) shall use SoRt Program funds to provide targeted professional development on Science of Reading provided through PAEC and JustRead Florida! (in targeted areas such as Tier I interventions, best practices, and curriculum supports), small group and individualized tutoring using Science of Reading strategies and materials, and purchase curriculum and supplies to support these initiatives (including iReady Magnetic Readers, Rewards, and Spire/Sound Sensible and auxiliary resources available through Wonders).
- 2. The project design includes hiring staff for academic tutoring during the academic year (part-time Reading Interventionists, after-school tutors, and support staff) as well as reviewing and purchasing curriculum and supplies to support Science of Reading integration (budget lines 8-20). Deliverables for the academic year include: time sheets and tutoring schedules, student data, and purchase order records. Summer 2024 the project will focus on developing and implementing Science of Reading Professional Learning activities (budget lines 1-7). Deliverables for the summer include time sheets, daily agendas, and handouts.

- 4. **Assurance 1, Target Population:** The LCSB will prioritize kindergarten through fifth grade students enrolled in a public school who either scored below a Level 3 on the English Language Arts (ELA) assessment in the prior year or who the district has determined through progress monitoring to be below grade level, through careful disaggregation of individualized student data; including FAST reading & math 2022-23 PM 3 & 2023-24 PM1, iReady diagnostics, and STAR, as applicable.
- 5. **Assurance 2, Designated Tutoring Time:** The LCSB will use funds for (a) stipends for tutors during the school day, before and after school, or a summer program, through

hiring part time Reading Interventionist teachers to work 1:1 or 1:up to 4 during the school day with targeted students using Science of Reading strategies and curriculum (budget lines 9-12) as well as hiring after school tutors to work 1:1 with students during the Outside the School Day programs using Science of Reading strategies and curriculum (budget lines 13-20); (c) professional learning focused on district led Science of Learning (budget lines 1-8); as well as (d) curriculum, resources and materials necessary to implement explicit and systematic instructional strategies (budget lines 21-26). All purchased instructional materials will be evidence- and research-based grounded in the science of reading and will meet the requirements of strong, moderate or promising evidence as defined by ESSA.

- 6. **Assurance 3, Initial and Ongoing Support**: The LCSB will provide initial and ongoing training and support to both during the day and afternoon tutors through targeted onboarding training by district staff regarding Science of Reading, and will provide an afternoon supervisor for tutors (budget lines 17-20).
- 7. **Assurance 4, Annual Reporting:** The LCSB will annually report to the Department no later than June 30, 2024, on the following:
 - a. Program expenditures by category
 - i. Fiscal Reports, including the program DOE 399 report as well as purchase orders and time sheets
 - b. Numbers of students served by the program by grade level
 - i. Student attendance data
 - c. Student outcomes as evidenced by 2023-2024 Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) progress monitoring results in ELA.
