UPDATE ON PRINCIPAL SEARCH

During the 2021 - 2022 school year, the Antonian School Council and the Archdiocese of San Antonio solidified terms for a comprehensive principal search to ensure the selected candidate is a strong match for the current needs and future vision of the school. The principal search process engages many stakeholders in the ACP community and utilizes a comprehensive timeline to complete the search. See below for the timeline.



MAY 2022

Conduct Parent Climate Survey, focusing on the school's Instructional Quality, Constituent Relations, Operational Excellence, Financial Health & Overall Satisfaction.



AUGUST - SEPTEMBER 2022

Conduct faculty and staff listening sessions, led by the Department of Catholic Schools, to gather feedback on the operational and academic leadership needs, culture, and climate of the school's working environment.



OCTOBER 2022

Request candidate nominations from faculty, staff, administration, and the School Council for positions on the Search Committee. The target Search Committee will consist of five to seven diverse members.



NOVEMBER 2022

Post principal position on the Archdiocesan website, Indeed, Jobs.com, LinkedIn, and National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA).



DECEMBER 2022

The School Council reviews and finalizes which nominees will comprise the Search Committee.



JANUARY / FEBRUARY 2023


The Search Committee convenes and reviews the Parent Climate Survey, Faculty Survey, and all insights gained through listening sessions of the faculty and staff. The Search Committee establishes specific interview questions grounded in the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Schools (NSBECS). The Search Committee evaluates applications, conducts interviews, and recommends final candidate(s) to the Superintendent.



MARCH 2023

The Search Committee reaches a consensus on a candidate and verifies successful completion of the candidate's background check. Candidate accepts position.

This process will continue until an individual is hired. Target date of completion is March 2023, but the search committee will be committed to the process until reaching a consensus on a candidate's successful completion of background checks and acceptance by candidate.

Antonian has had an incredibly busy but successful school year! Thus far, this year has been packed with several competitions and triumphs within our student life. There is much to celebrate; cross country girls prevailed as state champions, boys cross country were the state runner-up, varsity volleyball won the district championship and advanced to the state semifinals, the football team were district champions and state quarter finalists, cheer was named top 5 in the state and were named the 2023 NCA national champions, our silver dancers earned the title of TAPPS state champions, and our tennis program won the state team championship tournament!

In addition to that, the mighty Apache band finished 4th at state and received a superior 1 rating. The theater program, too, brought home a 3rd place trophy from the TAPPS state One-Act-Play competition, with an Antonian student being named Best Actor overall. Our student-led clubs and organizations are also continuing to thrive, with the Antonian Chess team winning 1st place at the IWHS Fall tournament and Latin recently placing 2nd in the Texas State Junior Classical League Area B Regionals.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING SNAPSHOT

CLASS OF 2022

- 94% of seniors in the class of 2022 attended a 4-year institution.
 Outside of this, 6% went to a 2-year school, one student enlisted in the U.S. Army, and one student enrolled in commercial dive school.
- \$28.2 million was earned in college scholarships.

SCHOOL SAFETY

Antonian takes campus safety very seriously and works hard to ensure the safety of our students, faculty, and ACP community. In the wake of recent school violence across the country, Antonian has created a safety committee that will work with a professional security advisor to assess the entire campus and identify any areas of security weakness or concern. This committee will be comprised of Fr. Pat O'Brien, Maricella Villanueva, Kurt Nowak, Sra. Turner, Mason Finch, and Gabby Calvillo. Once the assessment has been reviewed and an action plan developed, parents and our ACP community will be updated.

ACADEMICS

As the largest Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of San Antonio, Antonian offers a variety of honors, Advanced Placement, and dual credit classes. As we began the 2022-2023 school year, several changes were enacted to better serve our students. First, we were excited to offer new course options which include SAT prep, cybersecurity, and debate. In addition to this, instructional hours were made to run from 8:30 a.m. - 3:10 p.m., allowing the opportunity for teachers to be available for tutorials before and after school.

Our Learning Center continues to be a focal point for our students with learning differences. We began this school year with three full-time staff members to assist our students and provide them with individualized learning plans. Students enrolled in seminar class are provided academic assistance, study skills instruction, and academic skill building. Antonian remains committed to providing services necessary to ensure academic success for every student. Since the start of the school year, the testing center has been utilized more than 1,000 times by our accommodated students.



SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Antonian continues to set goals for school improvement in order to better serve our students and the ACP community; upgrades are happening! The 2021 school year saw the completion of the Marc Portell Elizondo Memorial Tennis Center. This year, full-length perforated vinyl graphics will be added to the glass doors and windows at the front entry of the school. In addition, Antonian has been approved for the Governor's Assistance to Private Schools (GAPS) grant program. With this assistance, we will be able to further support needs related to safety and security, technology, and instruction. We will be notified of funding by mid-March; at that time, we will reprioritize our needs and share the news with the Antonian family.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

As a result of 3 years managing COVID-19 and higher construction prices, Antonian's Capital Campaign Committee and School Council are reviewing all phases of the campaign to make sure initial objectives of the campaign are being met. In addition, Antonian will partner with Fox Hall residents to assure that the campaign addresses any concerns about new facilities and the totality of the campaign is meeting all objectives for students, faculty and future growth.
