# IV. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING SCHOOL SAFETY OPERATIONS A. Data Update – Mr. Thomas O'Connor

Mr. O'Connor presented a short slide deck covering the October 22, 2020 changes made by the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) to the criteria for "Safely Returning to In-Person Instruction." Mr. O'Connor also briefly discussed the additional change made by ADHS on October 30. See Attachment A.

Mr. O'Connor noted that the changes do not alter the safe opening criteria, though they do give governing boards some leeway in considering mitigation strategies in their opening decisions. The major changes included:

- Updates the research basis for the recommendation
- Provides explicit guidance for recommended instruction model based on current state of community spread
- Provides guidance on when to return to distance learning model
- Emphasizes mitigation strategies as a decision basis for in-person instruction

The updates do not change the in-person instruction criteria

Mr. O'Connor also covered current COVID-19 incidence rate in comparison to the safe opening criteria:

- The number of cases have declined from 7 two weeks ago, to 3 last week, and as of the report, no new cases in the Grand Canyon area
- The case rate at 161/100,000 is still above the opening criteria, though decreasing week-over-week
- The percent positivity rate at 6.2% is within the opening guideline, though it needs to be in this range for 2 weeks before the school meets the opening criteria

Mr. O'Connor addressed the concept of "acceptable risk," and who defines it. The ADHS, by establishing opening criteria, has established this standard. Mr. O'Connor advised that from his past experience in risk management, deviating from this standard poses a risk of changing the focal point of who defines acceptable risk, and advised that varying from the standard should be done with the advice of competent legal counsel.

Ms. Tosca Henry, the school's legal counsel, noted that the Board has been granted great latitude in opening decisions, and all decisions are fraught with risk. Opening before meeting ADHS guidelines risks a lawsuit if a student or staff member gets sick, and failing to open, and thus potentially not meeting the educational needs of students also constitutes a risk. Ms. Henry pointed out that these are difficult, complex decisions.

## B. School Update/AIA - Mr. Matt Yost

Mr. Yost discussed current attendance for the school's distance learning program and actions the school is taking to address students' social and emotional needs. These include curriculum-based programs during regular class, and also described some purely social activities which have occurred or are planned.

One of those extracurricular activities for example, was a pajama party, nighttime storytelling social over Zoom. Other planned activities include game nights, and possibly a virtual dance party.

Mr. Yost updated the Board on possible options for winter sports, specifically basketball.

- The gymnasium has been confirmed as usable for basketball
- Bus travel, if utilized, would be restricted to players and coaches only in order to enable social distancing
- Other school districts have had sports even though the school remained closed for in-person instruction, with the team members kept separate as a "pod" from other students

While Mr. Yost noted that we could provide basketball, he recommended against it because of the indoor nature of basketball in a pandemic increased risk of transmission, and it risked a perception that we focused on athletics over academics.

#### C. Discussion and possible action

#### Discussion:

The following is a brief overview of the topics which were discussed during this period. it is provided here to represent the general nature of the discussion, should not be considered a verbatim transcription of the discussion.

The discussion began with a statement from Mr. Hartigan that he would like to see students back in school in-person. He didn't feel that students were making adequate progress in a full-distance learning program. After making this statement, he opened the discussion to comments from other Board members.

The discussion generally covered options for when to bring students back for in-person learning. Key points made, which included invited comments from the school Principal and Superintendent, included:

- If in-person instruction began on Nov 16, this would result in a disruption of learning while staff and teachers were learning new processes. Then there would be a break for Thanksgiving. Do we want to have students on campus after possibly traveling for the holiday? If we waited till the following week, we'd have two weeks of instruction before winter break.
- We could start in-person instruction after winter break; however, there is the similar risk of starting
  right after Thanksgiving, heightened risk of virus spread from families traveling, suggesting a delay for
  in-person to the second week of January.
- This is only 3 weeks before the end of the semester, and disruptive just before end of semester finals and second quarter benchmarks.
- Dr. Bria suggested that we could shorten the semester, and transition to in-person learning earlier in January.
- There was discussion about starting preschool in-person instruction on Nov 16, since the focus of preschool is social interaction, not testable academic growth.

- Ms. Tosca Henry, school legal counsel, noted that while the Board has broad leeway in decisionmaking on when to return to in-person instruction, whatever criteria the Board uses for their opening decision, it needs to be uniform across the grades.
- The Board accepted input from the Preschool teacher on starting preschool students in November.
- The Board accepted input from the audience in attendance, and heard input from:
  - o Ms. April Krombeen Preschool Teacher
  - o Ms. Rebecca Markstein Second Grade Teacher
  - o Ms. Adrian Alvarez Middle School Science Teacher
- The Board also discussed the pros and cons of offering winter sports, specifically basketball and if it was appropriate to sponsor athletics when the school was not in session for in-person instruction.

Mr. Hartigan concluded the discussion with the below motion.

Motion: Continue distance learning until the end of the first semester, January 28, 2021. Delay

sports for the remainder of the first school semester. Continue to consider the ADHS guidelines, utilizing official reports from Arizona State and Coconino County and/or

distribution of vaccine.
