ALL CHILDREN HAVE A RIGHT TO AN EDUCATION

IF, due to a loss of housing:

- you must live in a shelter, motel, vehicle, or campground;
- on the street;
- · in abandoned buildings;
- or doubled-up with relatives or friends;

then you are eligible to receive services under the McKinney-Vento Act.

YOUR CHILD HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

Continue in the school they last attended before homelessness, to include transportation, if requested.

Enroll in school without giving a permanent address.

Participate in school programs with their peers.

Receive the same special programs and services, if needed, as provided to all other students.



Children can be encouraged by your interest in their day at school, their homework, and the information they bring home. Stay informed and engaged in your child's learning process!



School of origin


Ensure that students are kept in the school of origin, to the extent possible, unless it's contrary to wishes of the parent/guardian. The student's right to attend their school of origin extends throughout the homeless period.



REMOVE BARRIERS

Actively work to eliminate any barriers that may contribute to exclusion or an enrollment delay. Schools should immediately enroll, then work to retrieve vital records.

FREE MEALS

Public school children benefit from federal schoo nutrition programs that provide nutritious meals. Free breakfast and lunches are available to homeless children if they qualify for McKinney-Vento servives

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Children between ages 3 and 22, living in Gadsden County who are eligible for Exceptional Student Education (ESE) services and have been identified as homeless, may receive a variety of services. Parents who believe their student qualify, may request an evaluation.






POST INFORMATION
