While reading with your child, do you notice challenges with keeping them actively engaged in the reading process? In order to promote reading comprehension and interaction, try this strategy!

Use a coding system in the margins to mark the text as you read. If it is a school or library book, use sticky notes to prevent damage. During or after your reading, discuss the coding you used and share why each coding was used. This promotes active thinking and discussion about text. Below are just some examples of codes you can use while reading:
