THE GREAT SHAKEOUT

"The Great Shakeout" rocked the SMJUHSD and nine million others in California on Thursday, October 20th.

The SMJUHSD "Shake!" happened at Pioneer Valley, Righetti, Santa Maria, Delta, and the Mark Richardson Career Technical Education Center and Ag Farm. Everybody participated in the statewide drill to practice what to do during earthquakes, and to improve preparedness. Santa Maria High School held its drill separately.

Staff used the intercom to announce they were simulating an earthquake. Students were instructed to move away from windows and heavy objects and get beneath their desks in the "Drop, Cover and Hold On" position for one to two minutes. Checks were



conducted in all bathrooms, hallways, classrooms, and facilities before the "all clear" announcement ended the drill.

"Everyone knows that when we talk about earthquakes, it's not a matter of if, but when," said Director of Facilities, Operations and Transportation Reese Thompson.

ERHS Varsity Football Coach Tony Payne, who took over the program in 2018, stepped down Nov. 10 to have more family time and dedicate more time tohis special education classes.

He led the Warriors program for five seasons, which included last year's Central Section CIF Division 5 title, the first for Righetti in football.

SMHS NEW BUILDING

Construction on the new Santa Maria High School 50 classroom/admin building is now 83 percent completed and expected to be finished by April 2023, according to Gary Wuitschick, Director of Facilities & Logistics. Students and staff will be able to move in by Fall of 2023.

Presently, various activities by construction trades are underway. They include including tiling, fixtures, carpeting, ceiling grids, plumbing, electrical, painting, security systems etc.

The new building will help ease the congestion on Camino Colegio, that small dead-end street, now the front entrance. It will also create permanent classrooms and eliminate nearly all portable classrooms.

The three-story 88, 774 square-foot structure will face Morrison Avenue and feature visitor parking and a bell tower. It's paid for through Measure H, passed by voters in 2016.
