



#### DEDICATION

The Plateau recognizes Mr. Hodges for his outstanding efforts in developing this program, geared to the individual, and for his concepts and contributions in visual language and expression.

























# MR. ARLON WAY Assistant Principal

One new and well received idea this winter was a fashion show (far top right) held in the drama room where minis, maxis, pantsuits and even wedding gowns were modeled by their creators.
















Science is more than disecting, formulas, and microscopes. It is a study basic to life. At CCHS studies in the various fields are available.





Mrs. Mildred Hall, (below right) utilizes her bulletin boards to help her present concepts related to her general mathematics classes.









GALLATIN came to Crossville and, remembering their upset in '69, rolled a game that held the Jets scoreless for the third consecutive week. The Jets were in the game until a shakey 4th quarter, when the Green Wave swelled their lead to the final 25-0.

THE JETS, behind the accurate leg of Jimmy Rogers, took out their frustrations on an unsuspecting group of Bradley Bears and came away with a 15-14 upset. An exchange of fumbles gave the Jets the ball deep in Bradley territory and Joe Caruthers drove across the goal line for the first score of the season. In the fourth quarter of the Bradley game John Munroe blasted over from the one yard line, bringing it up to 14-12. With fourth down and two minutes to play, Jimmy Rogers kicked a 31 yard field goal, good for three points as the Jets nipped the Bears, 15-14.


