



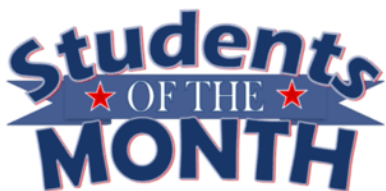

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### **Kindergarten**

This week kindergarteners started subtraction. Students are having fun making up story problems to match the subtraction number sentences.

Students learned the letters sounds for b, r, l, and u. We have learned so many letters, students were having fun spelling their name out in ASL. Sight words we have practiced are- some, said, you, I, and the. I think their favorite sight word is 'the' because they like to point out every time they find it throughout the day.

We also have been working on writing simple sentences. Students unscramble a sentence, write it out, and illustrate it. We are working on using a capital at the beginning of the sentence and a period or exclamation mark at the end.

At the beginning of the week we planted some special seeds I found. They grow best when it is quiet and they hear kind words. They are already sprouting! Everyone is having fun watching them grow because of our kind words.



### **First and Second Grade Explorers**

First and second graders are working hard to produce evidence-based responses and to write complete sentences. We have tackled the writing process and clarified what a topic, supporting sentences, and organization are over the past couple of months. This week we were working with real paragraphs!

Students should also now know the difference between fiction and non-fiction. As students read aloud for 20 minutes each night, discuss whether the book s/he is reading is true or not true. Discuss text features, letter sounds, and sentence structure.

Congratulations to **Brooklyn**! Brooklyn received our class' first XtraMath "Certificate of Achievement in Addition." Students are using XtraMath as a tool to build math fact fluency. Brooklyn answered all beginning addition facts in under 6 seconds! Please continue working on math facts at home. How many certificates can we earn this year?



### **Third and Fourth Grade Classroom**

This week both grades started working hard on their Christmas ornaments and cards. They are turning out great!

In math this week 3rd graders continued to work to understand division and the relationship between multiplication and division. We have used manipulatives and drawings to help us understand these concepts. 4th graders continued their work with fractions by learning to add and subtract fractions. We learned that in order to do this we need to first find common denominators, a skill we learned in our last chapter.

This week both 5th and 6th grade started new units in math after very successful chapter tests last week. 5th grade is moving on from multiplying decimals to dividing decimals and 6th grade is now working with percents and comparing them to the ratios we learned last chapter.

ELA continues with A Midsummer Night's Dream for both grades and in remembrance of Pearl Harbor Day, we studied an overview of WWII starting with the bombing of Pearl Harbor and finishing with VE day and the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki.
