Description	<p>Educators are mandated to consider Restorative Justice Practices in their school, but what does that look like? This training will take educators through implementing Restorative Justice practices in your local school. You will learn how to set high expectations while being supportive. You will practice how to provide direct feedback and how to ask questions that foster accountability. You will also learn the most effective methods to resolve common conflicts.</p> <p>Participants will also learn how to use and incorporate circles in their classroom or school. Circles create a positive learning environment. You will learn by participating in circles with other attendees, taking turns to learn how to facilitate. By the end of the day, you will be prepared to return to your school and run successful circles.</p>
