




ages autonomy; and language & communication allows children to voice their thoughts and ideas. Please be patient as your children become comfortable with school and their friends and teachers.

Greetings Families, This month we will be exploring the topic of 'SIGNS'. Throughout the month of November we will have discussions in class on what we would like to know about signs, what we would like to find out about signs, what are some characteristics about signs, where are signs found, how do signs help us, and so much more. This

month in Conscious Discipline we will be focusing on 'Intention' with the children, learning that with every action we take is preceded by an intention. Our intention as we approach a situation influences the outcome in profound ways. In CLASS this month we will be focusing on Language Modeling, which captures the quality and amount of the teacher's use of language-stimulation and language facilitation techniques while in the classroom, such as back & forth exchanges, contingent responding, and encouraging peer conversations. Cultural Lifeways, we will focus on hunting, children will learn that animals are a blessing that provide food, happiness, and blessings to our homes, and that the mountains are a sacred place where animals live.

Paguate classroom children are focusing on strengthening our fine motor skills and muscles, by using scissors, getting used to the 3-point finger grasp while holding our pencils, children are also making great strides when it comes to signing in and writing their names. Learning Highlight for this month – Fine Motor Development.

What is fine motor skills development and why is it important for children's development?

Fine motor skills refers to controlling small movements.

ENCOURAGING COMMUNCATIONS WITH YOUNG CHILDREN BY USING SIMPLE AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE: (ASL).

Why sign with YOUNG children? "Using sign language with young hearing children helps them see words, feel words, spell words, learn words, and communicate with words.," Dr. M. Daniels-Professor of Speech Communication, Penn State Univ. 2015. Author of Fostering Communication with Young Children.: Signing Fundamentals

We have all shown babies how to wave "bye-bye" and show "so big" using our hands. All young children can learn simple sign language because they understand communication with symbols before they can form words with their mouths. Users of sign language build more connections in the brain. Young children using sign language simply build more brain power!

Basic Key points to using ASL:

*Use eye contact with child

*Say the word when signing, (ex. Sign "more", & Say "more" at the same time)

*Start with simple words

Here are three simple common ASL words to use with young children especially for pre-verbal children (for more information or more ASL signs to use with older children, please contact Ms. Margaret).

INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM GUIDANCE

Research and experience has shown that to improve results for children with disabilities/special needs, programs must:

- Have high expectations for all children regardless of abilities
- Meet each child's needs to enable the children to access, participate and progress in the general curriculum to the maximum extent possible
- Ensure that special education is a service, rather than a place
- Provide appropriate special education services and supports in the general education classroom (IEP) & IFSPs (or home - IFSPs)
- The Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP-developed for children birth to age 3) and the Individual Education Plan (IEP-developed for children age 3 and older) are the tools to document how each child's special needs related to his/her disability will be met within the context of an educational environment.

Car seat safety

WHEN BROPPING OFF/PICKING UP YOUR CHILDREND, THEY MUS BE BUCKLED IN, AND IN THE APPROPRIATE CAR SEAT, WHEN PICKING UP, IF THE PARENT OR WHOM EVER IS PICKING UP YOUR CHILDREND, DOESN'T HAVE A CAR SEAT WON'T BE RELEASED.

WELL BE HAVING RANDOM CAR SEAT CHECKS FROM THE LAGUNA POLICE DEPARTMENT.

LIPS:

HAVE EVERYDAE IA THE CAR BUCLED. REMOVE BULK (COATS, ETC.) BEFORE BUCKLIAG KEEP STRAPS SNUG (IT'S A SAFETY REATRAINT).

Feeling sick

IF your child(ren) are feeling sick, please keep them home, they'll be more comfortable.

AND IF a CHILD GETS SICK DUFING PROGRAM HOURS, THEY WILL BE PLACED IN THE ISOLATION FOOM TO AVOID THE SPREAD OF ILLNESS. A PHONE CALL HOME TO PARENTS ASKING THAT THE CHILD BE PICKED UP WITHIN 30MINS TO BE TAKEN HOME.

IF THEY HAVE ANY SIGNS OF SYMPTOMS OF POSSIBLE SEVERE ILLNESS SUCH AS LETHARGY, UNCONTROLLED COUGHING, INTRABILITY, PERSISTANT CRYING, DIFFICUTLY BREATHING OF WHEEZING, VOMITING, NOTE: PARENTS SHOULD NOTIFY THE SCHOOL IF THEIR CHILD IS SICK OF VESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19.

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IF YOUR CHILD GETS SENT TO THE ISOLATION ROOM, AND THEN SENT HOME WITH SYMP-TOMS, PLEASE HAVE YOUR CHILD BE SEEN BY A DOCTOR AND TESTED. A NEGATVE TEST RESULT ALONG WITH A DOCTOR'S NOTE WILL BE REQUIRED TO CLEARING YOUR CHILD TO RETURN TO SCHOOL. A NOTICE GOES TO KATRINA RILEY AND EOC STAFF WITH THE SYMPTOMS YOUR CHILD IS HAVING.



TRIPLEDEMIC: COVID-19, FLU, & RSV

Covid cases are relatively low, but experts are concerned about the rise of certain Omicron variants to better at evading immunity from vaccines and infection than previous variants.

Flu has subsided through much of the pandemic, but as Covid restriction have eased, the flu appears to be making a comeback

RSV, it's a respiratory virus that manifests like a mild cold but can lead to pneumonia in young children. Young children may be especially at risk because after 2 years of lockdown they haven't been exposed to respiratory viruses and have little immunity. Together, these three viruses could be a powerful threat to public safety and are an excellent reason to stay vaccinated and vigilant as the weather gets colder.




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Greetings Parents and Families, I hope you all are enjoying and adjusting well to the coolness of the Fall season.

On October 20, 2022, it was announced that the Laguna Department of Education Board approved bi-weekly testing for all students that are not up-to-date or vaccinated. I know this is good news to our DEC families.

For the month of November, bi-weekly testing for the not up-to-date and unvaccinated will take place on the 3rd and 28th. Monthly testing for all students and staff will take place on the 14th. As of November



7th our testing days will change from Thursdays to Mondays. Giving parents time to get to the pod should a testing day be missed.

I just want to remind you to monitor your children daily for any occurring symptoms and get them tested if they are experiencing symptoms. In addition, please keep them home from school if they are not feeling well. We ask that you please call the school when your child will not be attending school for the day.

DEC staff continue with Covid safe practices. Temperatures are taken and questions are asked both at the center drop-off and on the bus. Please wear a mask when putting your children on/off the bus and when you're dropping off/picking up at the center. We want to ensure we are protecting our youngest learners and thank you for your cooperation.

I want to take this opportunity to thank all the parents that have chosen to get your child vaccinated and/or have started the vaccination series. I also want to thank all the households, our DEC children come from, for getting "up-to-date" with your vaccination status. This makes it easier to determine whether or not children need to be quarantined. I appreciate you taking the steps to help keep your child, your family, and all their friends at school safer. I also want to encourage parents to consider getting your child vaccinated if you haven't yet.

Thank you to all the veterans on your special day, you are very much appreciated. Have a Happy Thanksgiving, we have much to be thankful for, enjoy your time home with family and friends. May you all remain healthy and free from Covid-19 and its variants. Stay safe out there.




