The MPR is used regularly for OT and counseling, daily as an overflow classroom space, every recess on Rainy Days, monthly Board meetings and parent meetings, and for Sprouts after school.

Some of you have asked about the student restrooms; we are all anxious to have them built. The District must wait for the current project to be closed out before we can start on the student restrooms. We expect the final paperwork and state approval within the next few weeks. Next steps are to go through the required audit, and then we can go out for bid on the restrooms. The prefabricated restroom building has already been purchased, and is scheduled to be delivered and installed as soon as school gets out – we look forward to starting the 2025-26 year with new restrooms! We know that students have had to be patient with this process, and we look forward to all of this being behind us.
