Students who attended *More Than* Scrubs also learned how classes at the Houston College & Career Academy can help them earn dual enrollment credit while attending high school. This gives them an advantage after high school graduation because they have already earned college credit and/or an industry certification that allows them to enter the workforce directly.

Johnson explained that the school used a targeted approach to invite students to attend this event. She said, "Each high school student takes a test called YouScience that suggests possible career pathways for students based on their interests and aptitudes. This year, we reached out to students who showed a likelihood of interest in the careers that would be discussed at *More Than Scrubs*. This was a great way to introduce students to classes that will set them up for success in their future career fields."
