Dear Parishioners

Thank you to the Flurry of Fun committee and volunteers, to the caterers and musicians, auctioneers, and participants for the wonderful evening. With so many other activities, it was wonderful to see so many involved and attending

wonderful to see so many involved and attending.

This Friday, I will mark 3 years since my mother's death. It is hard to believe, as some days it seems like a lifetime ago, and other times, it feels so fresh and new. There are times when I really miss talking to her, or regret not talking to her enough, or find myself wishing to ask her something, either confirming a story or fact she knew or to tell her about some new fact or share of some random encounter. I know that this is only a small way that grief appears, and while I think I have navigated this well, I certainly understand why some grieve so much deeper. It means that we need to be accepting of the process, be gentle with ourselves, and honor those we miss.

I think I may have shared, but the image of riptides has been important for me in my grieving. When caught in a riptide, the instinct is to swim against it, to the point of exhaustion. But the better thing to do is allow the tide to take you, as long as you keep your head above water, and when it releases you, you can swim back to shore.

Grief is like that. When we try to go against it, it leaves us exhausted. But when we allow it to flow, making sure we don't get pulled under, we find our way through it. Like Christ on the Cross, He had to endure it, and in doing so, conquered it not only for Himself but for all of us.

Many of us perhaps have heard of the stages of grief (denial, anger, bargaining, depression, and acceptance). While these are 5 common stages for grieving, they are not always linear and clear. We may go through several stages a few times, skip some entirely, or find ourselves caught in a loop perhaps. This is where we need the Lord most – that He would help us find acceptance. Acceptance is not that we are happy that the other has passed, but that we accept that reality and trust in the presence of the Lord.

I miss my Mom. But I trust that the Lord is giving her peace and I pray for her eternal rest. And God willing, when He calls me home, we will praise Him together for eternity. I do not want to rob her of that joy. So, I might well up, choke back a tear, allow a crack in my voice as I speak of her, but I know that God has her. I can pray for her, continuing to offer Mass and prayer for her and when I do, I can feel a deeper communion with her because of our faith.




