LUKE 5:1-1

1. Begin your reading time with a short prayer (an example):

a.Dear Jesus, please help us to hear your Word and know you better. Guide our conversation and help us to grow to love and know you better. Amen.

- 2. Read the Passage together (aloud) once. And then take time to look at it a second time.
- 3. What stands out to you? Is there a word, phrase... etc. Discuss the words that stand out for both of you. This is a great place to wonder and contemplate what Jesus is saying or doing.
- 4. Where were the fishermen when Jesus approached them and asked them to get into the boat? (check out verse 2)
- 5. Why did Jesus seek to get into their boats? Why do you think so many people want to hear what He has to say?
- 6.Do you ever feel like Jesus got in your boat without you? What might that mean? (think: what could the boat be a symbol of)
- 7. How would you describe Simon Peter's reaction to Jesus and His requests? Explain why you think so?
- 8. What do you think the deep water could symbolize? What about the net? Fish?
- 9. What happens when Simon Peter listens to Jesus and puts his nets out into the deep water?
- 10. Does anything surprise you about Simon Peter's reaction to this miracle? Why or why not?
- 11. What is Jesus' response to Simon Peter?
- 12. How did the fishermen respond to Jesus' invitation?
- 13. Do you see Jesus' invitation to follow Him as something worth leaving everything behind to follow? Why or why not?
- 14. Take a moment to look up the following Saints. Focus on how they died...
- 15. Ss. Felicity and Perpetua (these two are almost always found together)
 - a. St. Tarcisius
 - b. St. Paul Miki and Companions
 - c. St. Charles Lwanga
- 16. What do they have in common? What about faith in Jesus gave them the courage to face all they faced?
- 17. How do these saints challenge the way you view faith?
- 18. How can you follow Jesus this week (be specific)?
- 19. Conclude with a short prayer...
