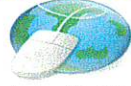

4K – 2nd Grade

For 4K/5K, continue to work on the sounds of words that begin with f, o, g, th, w, and ch. Practice having the students write their first name. Practice having them write the words bat, nut, cat, etc. Draw an example of an island and a lake and have the children identify the island and the lake.

For 1st/2nd, practice finding items in your home that are nouns (person, place, or thing). Students are identifying these parts of speech with a small black triangle within their classroom as well as within sentences they write in class. In math, allow students to identify place value within two-digit numbers.

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
