



Congratulations to all of these students on a job well done! Dyersburg City Schools is proud to have been represented in such a prestigious way at the 2024 Dyer County Fair!







>>> CAREER EXPLORATION

Students have been able to explore different career paths and volunteer at the same time, at our local Humane Society. Whether it was walking a nervous dog, fostering a stray cat, or cleaning a cage, our future leaders were gaining far more than hands-on experience; they were excavating the endless possibilities and learning about invaluable careers!



>>> NURSING EDUCATION

Students learn about the basics of the healthcare field. Students learn communication skills, medical terminology, anatomy & physiology and how to take vital signs in classes such as Health Science, Medical Therapeutics, Medical Terminology, & Nursing Education. The students who complete Health Science, Medical Therapeutics, and Medical Terminology are eligible to take the dual enrollment Patient Care Technician class their senior year. In the PCT class these students have the opportunity to receive a Healthcare Technician diploma from Dyersburg State Community College.

Students in the 1st nine weeks have already earned three certifications: OSHA 10, CPR, and First Aid.



>>> CRIMINAL JUSTICE

>>> AV PRODUCTION

A/V Production I classes spent the first month of school learning the practices of photography and videography. They learned the various types of shots, angles, and concepts of videography inclyding some of the most commonly used terms. This month, students finally had the opportunity to get cameras out and practice what they've learned. They first learned how to work the camera while in auto mode. They then moved to manual mode and learned how to adjust the exposure to get the best picture possile. They are getting better and better each day.

A/V Production II classes have begun working on social media ads for local businesses. Students have chosen a local business to create an ad for that can be used and shared online. Next month, these videos will be distributed to the businesses. We've loved the opportunity to work with local businesses such as Blossoms, Daylight Donuts, Sportsplex, The Chamber of Commerce, Sonic, The Mustard Seed, and Family Practice Clinic. Each student also chose a non-profit group to create a video showcasing what they do and how to reach out to them. These students are working with these groups and businesses to create a video that will help our community.



>>> COLLEGE STREET CAMPUS

At College Street Campus, we want students to have the opportunity for hands-on CTE classes. At this time, we currently have Welding using augmented reality. This was provided through Ermco and has been a great addition to our program. Students can increase their skills with welding and are scored with each try. We also have a Button Maker. Our students have already made over 500 buttons for the staff of Dyersburg City Schools. We have heat presses for making T-shirts and hats. We were able to attach the patches for scrubs for the Nursing program at DHS. In the spring, we will be incorporating Ag through our greenhouse and raised flower beds. Our goal is to model Marketing and Business skills with our buttons, t-shirts, hats, and greenhouse plants. In all these areas, students will learn specific job skills that will be invaluable.
