



May 6, 2022

- Preview SAC Minutes Review by John Miller SAC Chair
  - Acceptance and Review of April Minutes-
    - Motion to Accept- Mr. Unzueta

- Administrative Report- Presented by Mrs. Griffiths
  - Teacher Appreciation- A HUGE thank you to our staff!
    - We appreciate the teamwork and family atmosphere
  - We are excited that we have posted the signs for Dr. Rodolfich's incentive plan for Just Read 20 in both English and Spanish.
  - We met with a company that will do after school care at JHW and the school will receive a portion of the fee.
  - Uniforms will be updated to Khaki and Navy for bottoms and no jeans. Flyers will be going home to let parents know and will be posted on our website.
  - Engineer is needed for the school to add asphalt to the back area for staff parking.
  - Traffic is still a concern as the student's safety is still at risk. Students are crossing D street without a crossing guard as parents are parking there instead of using the car rider line. Families are also driving up D and E street and cutting across the line.
    - We are planning on moving the car rider line to the front of the school and moving the bus line to the back of the school.
  - The school is waiting for the city to update their ordinance for this area to update our sign due to the lighting.
    - Griffiths to send an email to the city for update.
  - Administration worked with the city to approve the front of the school as the car rider area and the back of the school as the bus rider area to assist with traffic concerns.
    - The school ordered signs to make it a right turn only leaving the car rider area for the 22/23 school year. We are looking to update the "Do Not Enter Signs"
  - The staff worked together to determine the placement of classrooms around the campus to meet the needs of the growth of the new units.
    - Thank you to PCSB for approving our units to take our enrollment for 442.
    - Recommended to reach out to Candlelight, LWHS, and Bok N to help teachers move their furniture and supplies.
