

Kindergarten

Greetings parents, Kindergarten is coming along nicely in all of the subjects that they are being taught. For science, the current topic is "Sound", with the students learning about what creates sound and how sound travels. For math, the current topic is "Simple Addition and Subtraction", with the students learning to add and subtract with the numbers 1 - 10. For Reading, the current topics are "Beginning, Middle, and Ending Sounds / Reading Simple Sentences / Sight Words", with the students being encouraged to have their parents make sure they read or read along with them for at least 30 minutes a day. Read along books can be found on Youtube. For social studies, the current topic is "Where Do I Live", with the students being encouraged to learn their parent's first and last name, address, phone number, etc.

We are also looking forward to learning about the pilgrims and Indians for thanksgiving and our "Breakfast with Santa" fundraiser. As we look ahead, we will continue to work with parents to ensure that all students are progressing towards their goal of going to First Grade. In First Grade for the month of November in ELA, the students are learning to form and write complex sentences along with using proper nouns and appropriate capitalization. We are stressing the importance of learning sight words and to practice reading every day. In math, they have begun using their subtraction skills and learning how to dissect and solve word problems. In science, they are observing living and nonliving things and will begin learning the plant life cycle. In social studies, the students are being exposed to community workers, historical events and how that relates to the present times.



Second Grade

2nd grade will be working on Forces in Motion in Science, why we celebrate Thanksgiving for Social Studies, addition and subtraction in math, fables in reading and completing our expository writing activity. 
