Senior and AP Exams - You must be in regular school uniform. Seniors who are not taking an exam are not to be on campus or the campus of any school in the Lanett City School System. You must leave the campus immediately when you complete your exams.

Fee Deadline - all school fees and graduation fees must be paid in full. Graduation fees (\$115) include cap and gown, diploma, diploma cover, mini-diploma, and yearbook. Cords for Advanced Diploma, National Honor Society, and Beta Club are \$12 each. Stoles for honors graduates are \$10. Pay in the main office. Fees must be paid in cash, money order, cashier's check or online at myschoolbucks.com. No personal checks.

This is a mandatory practice. Therefore, you must make arrangements to be present and on time. You have plenty of time to arrange your work schedules, etc., so no excuses will be accepted. If you do not practice, you do not participate. You must be in compliance with the dress code for dress down days.

Tickets for admission to graduation in the auditorium (in the case of bad weather) will be distributed at this practice. You will sign for these tickets and will not be given additional or replacement tickets.

Wear your cap & gown. You must follow the dress code for graduation. If you are not properly dressed, you will not be allowed to participate.

Bill Miller Photographers will be at graduation to take an individual photo of the presentation of your diploma. Ms. Smith will provide package options. Pictures will be mailed to your house. You can bring a check made payable to Bill Miller Photographers, or the CORRECT amount of cash with you when you report to the scoreboard for graduation. Ms. Smith will be there to collect your money for the photographer. Make sure you know your correct mailing address.

Immediately following graduation, report to the visitor’s sideline where you will receive your senior packet, which includes your diploma. Senior sponsors will be there for only 20 minutes. If you are late, you can pick up your senior packet the following week in the LHS office.

With regard for the health and safety of students, staff, family, and friends, we will make every effort to host commencement ceremonies in the stadium with as few restrictions and limitations as possible. Based on current health conditions, if graduation is held in the stadium, there will not be any limitations to attendance and tickets will not be required. In the event that it becomes unsafe to gather outdoors, the ceremony will be held in the auditorium. Each graduating senior will receive an allotment of tickets that will be required for entry into the building.

Graduation Ceremonies Dress Code

General Guidelines

- No jeans, tennis shoes, or flip flops will be permitted for any of these events
- As a safety concern, flats are recommended over heels for all events
- No painting, decorations, or alterations of any kind may be applied to any part of the cap or gown
- Senior sponsors and/or LHS administration reserve the right to require a graduate to remove or change any garment or accessory that is deemed inappropriate
- Any student that does not comply with the dress code will have their diploma withheld until disciplinary consequences are completed or may not be allowed to participate in the ceremony

Guidelines for Shirt/Pants

Awards Day, Baccalaureate Practice, Baccalaureate Service, and Graduation

- Solid white dress shirt
- Solid black dress pants
- Solid black necktie or bowtie
- Solid dark brown or black belts, socks, and shoes

Guidelines for Dresses

Awards Day

- Solid white dress or solid black dress
 - No patterns or combinations of black and white
 - No spaghetti straps – a solid white sweater or cardigan may be worn with white dresses; a solid black sweater or cardigan may be worn with black dresses
 - Dress must be no shorter than the width of a \$1.00 bill from the knee when standing
 - Dress should be modestly cut in the front so as not to show too much cleavage
 - Proper undergarments must be worn
- Shoes must be solid black, white, nude, or brown – no gold, silver, or other colors allowed

Baccalaureate Practice, Baccalaureate Service, and Graduation

- Solid colored dress that stays concealed underneath your gown
 - Dress should not be longer than the graduation gown, but no shorter than the width of a \$1.00 bill from the knee when standing
 - Neckline should be rounded or v-shaped to stay concealed beneath the gown, but not plunging
- Shoes must be solid black, white, nude, or brown – no gold, silver, or other colors allowed

Guidelines for Jewelry (all events)

- Jewelry should be modest, in good taste, and not draw attention to oneself
- Jewelry may not be worn over the top of any article of clothing, including the gown
- A small silver, gold, or pearl necklace may be worn with dresses
 - Necklaces may be no larger than 8mm in width and may include a charm or pendant that can be covered with a quarter
- Body piercing adornments are limited to studs, pearls, and other stones that are no larger than 8mm in diameter
 - Hoops or dangling earrings are not allowed

Graduation Ceremonies Behavior Code

Graduation from high school is an important event in the lives of students, parents, and families. It is an opportunity to celebrate the educational accomplishments of graduating seniors. All graduation ceremonies, including awards day, baccalaureate, and graduation, are dignified events and require that all attendees be on their best behavior. All students deserve full recognition for his or her hard work. A behavior by one student that distracts from the recognition of another is considered inappropriate. Any student exhibiting inappropriate behavior or failing to comply with the instructions of the faculty will have their diploma withheld until disciplinary consequences are completed.

Examples of inappropriate behavior include but are not limited to:

- Dancing and vocal/visual disruptions
- Use of cell phones at any time during the ceremony
- Excessive talking or laughter during the ceremony

All graduates must adhere to the specific dress requirements as outlined in the “Graduation Ceremonies Dress Code” section in the senior calendar. Any student that does not comply with the dress code will not be allowed to participate in the ceremony.

Signed contracts must be returned to homeroom teachers no later than May 4, 2022.
